## Group calls for easing of regulations on continuing care

LeadingAge New York, which represents nonprofit and public nursing homes, senior housing, retirement and assisted living facilities, is calling on the state Legislature to pass a bill that would ease regulations and allow for more development of continuing care retirement communities across the state.

The bill is sponsored by Senate Health Committee chair Kemp Hannon, a Republican from Long Island, and Assemblyman Robin Schimminger, a Democrat from Erie County.

These campus-based senior housing options offer a continuum of care so that amenities and services change along with seniors' needs.

The state's 12 Continuing Care Retirement Communities are responsible for nearly \$500 million in economic activity, and support 2,000 jobs, according to a report from LeadingAge.
