

## **Nursing Home Salary Report**

This report provides a compilation of data collected during the 2013 LeadingAge NY Nursing Home Salary Survey. Participants reported wage and salary data as of March, 2013. The figures in the report are based on 152 surveys received from not-for-profit and public nursing homes.

The report contains data for 17 management and 17 non-management positions. Separate pages for management and non-management positions can be accessed using the Excel Worksheet tabs (near the bottom of the screen) labeled "Management" and "Non-Management". After selecting the appropriate page (tab), view a desired report by selecting a job title and the desired geographic breakout using the drop down menus. Each report contains graphs and a table showing one job title at a time.

The pages are formatted to print and provide the user with a custom, single page report with data on the user-selected position narrowed to user-selected geographies.

Salary/wage data for each position may be viewed in 29 breakouts based on geography and sponsorship. The "Geography" tab provides definitions of the regional breakdowns used in the report. The number of facilities that each comparative figure is based upon is shown in each table as "Number of Homes Reporting".

To ensure the drop-down menus operate correctly, please select "enable" or "enable content" if prompted to do so when opening the file.

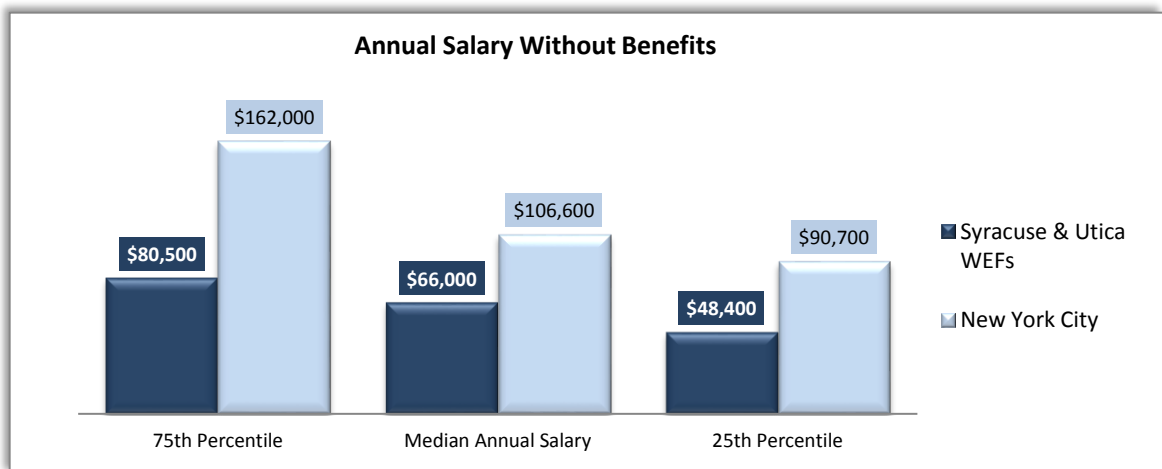

The 25th percentile figure marks the dividing line between the lowest quarter and the second lowest. The 75th percentile figure marks the dividing line between the highest quarter and the second highest. The median is the middle, with half of the salaries falling above this figure, half falling below. Medians are not likely to be skewed by outliers while averages may be.

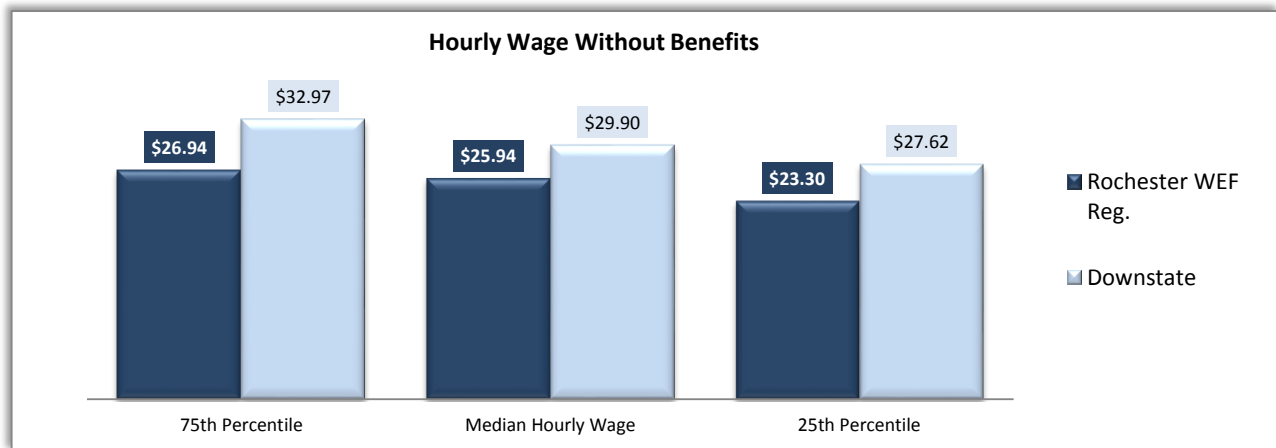
The survey collected weekly salaries effective March 2013 along with 2012 annual bonus information. The annual salary figure was calculated by multiplying the 2013 weekly salary by 52 and adding the 2012 annual bonus. Only full time positions (35 hours per week or more) are included. Blanks indicate that the sample was too small to report (fewer than 5 responses).

The survey also asked respondents to report average benefits as a percent of salary for all management positions using the same definition of "benefits" as used in the RHCf cost report. This benefits percentage was then applied to the annual salary. Annual bonus, if any, was added after the benefit percentage was applied. Responses that did not report benefits are included in the "Salary with Bonus" calculation but not in the "Salary with Benefits and Bonus" data.

The "small facility" breakout includes homes with 210 or fewer beds. "Large facility" group includes homes with 190 or more beds. Please see the "Geography" tab for a list of counties that comprise each region.

The survey collected hourly wages effective March 2013 along with 2012 annual bonus information. The annual bonus (if any) was divided by 2080 and that amount was added to the hourly rate.

Blanks indicate that the sample was too small to report (fewer than 5 responses).

The survey asked respondents to report average benefits as a percent of salary for all non-management positions using the same definition of "benefits" as used in the RHCf cost report. This benefits percentage was then applied to the hourly wage. Annual bonus, if any, was added after the benefit percentage was applied. Responses that did not report benefits are included in the "Hourly Wage with Bonus" calculation but not in the "Hourly Wage with Benefits and Bonus" data.
