- ☐ The final IDT Policy was issued on 6/5/14. This Policy will be in effect for Demonstration Year 1.
- ☐ The remaining desk deficiencies related to the IDT were also issued and Plans had to submit responses on Tuesday.
- DOH and CMS met with Plans in NYC on 5/29/14 to discuss the enrollment process.
- ☐ The next meeting is scheduled for 6/23/14 in NYC. At this meeting we plan to discuss the draft enrollment guidance, enrollment scenarios, Maximus file formats, as well as distribute an enrollment FAQ.

The Three-Way Contract:

- The draft contract was shared with Plans, providers, and advocates on April 28th.
- □ Plans, providers and advocates submitted priority comments and conferences calls were held to discuss the comments received.
- DOH/CMS will send a revised contract to Plans for their signature on or about June 16.
- Plans must return signed contracts by July 7th.

- ☐ The pre-enrollment validation tools were submitted on May 28th.
- DOH/CMS are reviewing submissions and results will be included in the readiness review reports which will be sent in early August.
- □ Plans were required to cure remaining desk review and network deficiencies.

- DOH and CMS established an Encounter Data work group to develop the encounter submission process for the demonstration, details are being worked out.
- The Marketing Guidance and three template chapters were issued to Plans in May.
- Marketing materials not impacted by the IDT must be submitted by June 16th this includes the directory, and three chapters.
- ☐ The remaining chapters impacted by the IDT Policy will be sent soon and will have a different submission date.
- Plans submitted marketing plans which are under review.
