Upcoming Passive Enrollment Schedule

• July 1:

- 60-day notice was sent on April 27, 2015.
- 30 day notice was sent on May 26, 2015.
- 3,908 individuals will be passively enrolled in July, as of June 1.

August 1:

- 60 day letter was sent May 26, 2015.
- 30 day letter will be sent June 24, 2015.
- 5,584 individuals are set to be passively enrolled in August, as of June 1.



FIDA Update

Since the last Policy and Planning meeting, the following has occurred:

- The revised Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) policy comments are being reviewed for additional changes.
- Calendar Year 2016 Plan Benefit Package (PBP) submissions were due June 1, 2015.
- ADD File submissions were due June 5, 2015.
- Encounter data update DOH will halt encounter data submissions until All Payer Database is implemented.
- Standard Clauses guidance was distributed.
- Non-interference guidance reminder was distributed.
- Outreach letter and a FAQ issued to Medicaid and Medicare providers.
- Outreach letter regarding FIDA was sent to approximately 43,000 individuals who are eligible for FIDA, but have not yet opted out nor have been passively enrolled.



FIDA Update

Outreach and Education Event for Providers

- On Thursday, June 18, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and DOH will convene a roundtable for plans and providers.
- The event will begin with an overview and update of FIDA by DOH and CMS. A panel
 of FIDA Plan Medical Directors will highlight the benefits of FIDA and their best
 practices and experiences.
- An open discussion will follow to facilitate collaboration between providers and plans.
- The event will be held from 10 a.m. to Noon at the CMS Regional Office in Manhattan.
- Attendance for plans is limited to two individuals per plan.
- Providers and plans must RSVP to CMS at: <u>Melissa.Seeley@cms.hhs.gov</u> by June 15, 2015.



Alternative Payments

- Section 2.7.3 of the three-way contract requires plans to move its provider payment agreements from fee-for-service to alternative payment arrangements.
- The contract requires plans to submit proposals for DOH review and approval by July 1, 2015.
- DOH is extending the due date to August 15, 2015.
- DOH will release more detailed instructions this week.






Statewide Enrollment

Number of Plans Statewide Actively Enrolling **70**






MLTC Upstate Transition

MLTC Update

- CMS approved the following counties for transition in June: Essex, Chemung, Chautauqua, Hamilton, Schuyler, Seneca, and Yates.
- The "Front Door" will close for those new to community-based long term care (CBLTC) services on close of business June 19, 2015.*
- As of June 22, 2015, new users in these counties will go to NY Medicaid Choice for education / choice / and referral to the Conflict Free Evaluation and Enrollment Center (CFEEC) for evaluation.



CFEEC Activity as of June 1, 2015

- The CFEEC is operational in Regions 1 through 6.
- Region 7 timeline was adjusted and posted on MRT #90.
- Letters were sent to the Local Department of Social Services Commissioners for early June.
- Average call volume is 628 to 645 per day.
- 144 nurses are on staff to handle the volume, more will be added as needed.
- Evaluations conducted to date:
 - 98% approval rate
 - 2% denial rate



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
