Working as a registered occupational therapist for over 30 years, Ms. Snow's wealth of experience has led her to develop Positive Approach[™] to Care techniques and training models that now are used throughout the world by families and professionals working or living with dementia or other brain changes. Her handson caregiving experiences include providing direct care in community and wellness centers, day programming sites, home care settings, assisted living and CCRC communities, long term care facilities, outpatient clinics, hospitals and rehabilitation settings. She has served in a wide variety of leadership and advisory positions in professional organizations at both state and national levels, including the Alzheimer's Association, Alzheimer's Foundation of America, AOTA and NBCOT.
