Subject: Biweekly Updated COVID-19

Vaccine Administration Status

Dear Nursing Home Operators and Administrators:

The purpose of this letter is to inform providers of new data that will be updated and distributed biweekly to all New York State nursing homes. As the New York State Department of Health ("Department") continues to recognize COVID-19 as an ongoing threat to the health of long-term care facility residents and staff, this update will detail the vaccination efforts of our nursing homes.

As of 01/16/2024:

- The total number of residents in NYS nursing homes is **97,249.**
- The total number of consenting NYS nursing home residents who are awaiting administration of the updated COVID-19 vaccine is 5,864. This accounts for 6% of the total number of residents in NYS nursing homes.
- The total number of updated COVID-19 vaccinations administered to nursing home residents in NYS since **9/15/2023 is 46,646**.
- The total number of updated COVID-19 vaccines administered to nursing home residents in NYS in the **previous seven days is 1,878**. This accounts for 4% of the total number of vaccines administered to nursing home residents since 9/15/2023.
- The total number of NYS nursing homes reporting is 602.
- The total number of NYS nursing homes that administered the updated COVID-19 vaccine to residents since 9/15/2023 is 559. This accounts for 93% of the total number of NYS nursing homes.

The Department will continue to extend its efforts to contact nursing homes that have not yet reported vaccinations to understand the potential factors contributing to this concern.
