One of the flagship programs, the RCNS Intergenerational Morning Meeting at The Adult Day Program, has been running strong since September 2022. Every Wednesday at 11:00 am, the nursery school's four-year-old class visits the Adult Day Program at Brookmeade to engage in enriching activities. From singing songs to practicing yoga moves and sharing art projects, the children and seniors alike bond over shared experiences, fostering a sense of community and joy.

The Children begin each visit by singing the good morning song, naming each child, teacher, Adult Day participant and all the staff.

The children have gotten to know everyone by name and they love to sing, do yoga and dance with them.

Their new favorite song to sing with them is "Who Stole the Cookies from the Cookie Jar?"

Everyone laughs and giggles when their turn comes and we say their name.

"Fred Stole the Cookies from the Cookie Jar!"

They say "Who Me!?,

We say "Yes you!",

They say "Couldn't be!"

we say "Then Who?"

Then they point to a friend and they sing it all over again.



Additionally, the RCNS Intergenerational STEM Building at The Adult Day Program, launched in January 2024, further strengthens these intergenerational bonds. On Friday afternoons at 2:00 pm, the nursery school's afternoon preschool class joins their senior neighbors for STEM-focused activities. Through hands-on projects and games, such as building with magnetic blocks and playing interactive sports, the children and seniors collaborate, learn, and laugh together, creating cherished memories in the process.

At their First Meeting the children brought some finished projects they had made using their "Space Builder Set" of interlocking sticks and balls and showed the registrants at Meadow's Adult Day Healthcare Program what they had created and how the pieces interlocked and came apart.

Then the children and Seniors all played "Bounce and Pass The Big Red Ball" around the circle to one another. Everyone laughed as the ball flew around the room. We soon changed the game to kick the ball, then back to bouncing and passing.

Rhinebeck Community Nursery School looks forward to many more weeks of building and playing together with Magnatile magnetic building blocks, Inside Basketball, Dulpo/ Lego Bridge Building and lots of laughter.
