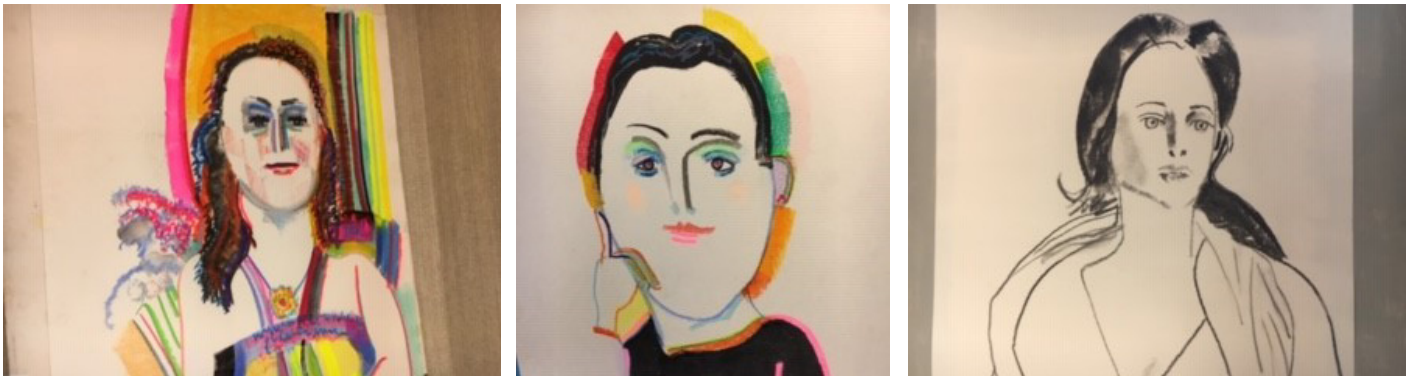


VillageCare at 46 & Ten Resident Arne Lewis Presents Personal Artwork
