**RIVERSPRING LIVING PRESIDENT AND CEO DANIEL REINGOLD
APPOINTED TO NEW YORK CITY MAYOR-ELECT ERIC ADAMS TRANSITION TEAM**

(Riverdale, NY) – DECEMBER 7, 2021: RiverSpring Living President and CEO Daniel Reingold has been appointed to New York City Mayor-elect Eric Adams’ transition team. Reingold, a leader in the field of long-term care and aging, has developed numerous programs and services that advocate for the civil rights and quality of life of older adults.

Throughout the pandemic, Reingold has provided leadership and advocacy for older adults, embodying compassion and ingenuity in developing policies and protocols for keeping elders safe while maintaining their quality of life.

Reingold opened the Weinberg Center for Elder Justice, the nation’s first elder abuse shelter, in 2005, penned the nation’s first sexual expression policy in long-term care, and created Project HOPE (Healthcare Offers Permanent Employment) which gives learning disabled high school students the opportunity to complete their education while developing job skills at the Hebrew Home at Riverdale.

Reingold maintains a highly visible presence on the national level, having testified before the U.S. Senate Special Committee on Aging, attending the 2015 White House Conference on Aging and appearing before numerous governmental and public policy bodies.

Prior to joining RiverSpring Living, Mr. Reingold was an attorney in private practice for 10 years.
